

Methamphetamine and Other Substance Abuse in California

The following information is from <u>Methamphetamine: Treatment Demographics in California</u>, by the California State Department of Alcohol and Drug California State Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs

- Methamphetamine (MA) is the most commonly reported primary drug of abuse for all race/ethnicities in the California treatment system except for African Americans.
- For African American women under 21, MA surpassed cocaine/crack in primary drug of abuse ranking in 2004-05.
- Primary MA abuse accounts for 53% of the total Asian/Pacific Islander female admissions into the California AOD (Alcohol and Other Drug) treatment system. A large range exists from 68% for Filipinos to under 35% for Samoans in 2004-05:
