When searching for a good location to host your health fair, it is important that you select events that are annually attended by local residents rather than people from other counties. Stay away from events that bring in a large number of people from different parts of California or from a range of income brackets. The key is to find local events that are tailored to people in a given region of the county or that have shown to attract people who in most need of your services. The following pages include annual parades, festivals, and other cultural observances that hold much promise in being great spots to hold health fairs.
